

The World Government is getting closer

The Stock Exchange has the "invisibles", too. This is the surprising headline on the first page of the italian *Corriere Economia* (october 26th 2009). Who are these "invisibles"? For sure it is not by chance that they are referring to the "invisibles" within some normal reflections on the Stock Exchange. It seems that most of them are very-very rich Bankers, the greatest 'Capitalists' of all (I say "it seems", because they are surrounded by mystery).

It is surprising to read an open reference to the élite of Power which in fact is ruling the World; nobody talks about them, and this is why they are "invisible". But we can see the effects: "globalization" is quickly gaining ground, and it is pursued with unrelenting will and a very subtle strategy by those very same "invisibles" who are about to accomplish the World Government and the New Order that they had in mind. To reach this goal, it was necessary to level, uniform, homogenize and unify everything: markets, coinage, territories, nations, governments, customs, values, religions, sexes, bodies. Nothing remained untouched by this information: both in America and in Europe we are in front of the *fait accompli*.

But there is something that the "invisibles" cannot immediately and openly unify, until when they will hold all the power in their hands: the democratic governments. The reason for this is clear: in any democracy, in order to survive, Parliaments need to have two opposite ideas. Opposite means that the ideas have to be different from each other. In the flatness of the "only thought", if needs, wishes and values are all the same, how would it be possible to go on with the democratic system, its Parties, the Left and the Right, the Liberals and the Socialists, and with the votes in the Parliament? This is why today we just have the pseudo-politics of the perpetual quarrel, the emptiness of gossip, the discussions about nonentity, the invention of nothing.

This situation, as someone could think, it is not typical of Italy alone: it is very similar in all democratic states, in the United States as

in France or England: each of these Countries has its sex scandals, bribes and cuts, and favors. In some countries they are not called "parties" any more, but "associations", lobbies. Everybody, especially the politicians, knows that Parliaments are just an empty façade. In Italy the situation is more difficult than in the other States, because we have a Left that remained still, anchored to the communist ideals. Which are coinciding with almost all the ideals of the World Government that is about to be accomplished. This is why the Left is unable to make even a pretense of opposition: equality, internationalism, mondialism are its creed. This is why no one more than the Left likes the European unification, the elimination of Nations, the supra-national Government and the equality between religions, ethnic groups, peoples, individuals, sexes. This is why the Left has an unrestrained passion for immigrants, for muslims and for homosexuals.

The truth is, although, that great bankers and major capitalists are those who are pushing towards the unification of peoples and governments. This could seem a contradiction but it is not: the more the subjects are equal, the easier is to govern them. In Italy, for many years the Left condemned as its worst enemies all "masters": landlords, employers or industry owners, all "the rich", in a word. This situation is paralyzing the Left, which does not know what to propose, since is not able any more to denounce the crimes of the great American Banks, who are the greatest responsible of the economic crisis. There was not one single strike against the Banks.

Since the Left does not have anything against which they can oppose, we can say that there just one last enemy for them: Berlusconi. But is it really so? Because also Berlusconi is an enthusiastic supporter of the European unification, which is the fundamental step towards the World unification. Without hesitation he undersigned all Treaties; he likes the World organizations and works to widen their power both in the East and in Africa. Berlusconi takes part in the banker's summits.

Is that of the Left just a personal hate, as many opinion makers say? But personal hatred is not politics, and as it is clear that it would mean the end of the Left. Behind the hate against Berlusconi, which is needed to feed the followers of the Party, it is very likely that the Left is silently working to make all parliamentary discussions completely devoid of any real meaning. And to speed up the end of the National Parliaments which is indispensable to establish and put in office the World government.
