Towards the End of the Battle?

President Klaus' office answered to the letter of *Italiani Liberi* through the foreign editorial office of the italian newspaper "Il Giornale": a very kind letter, revealing an extremely important thing we knew noting about: "*We get many supporting letters and e-mails from all european countries*." Letters that are asking him not to sign the Lisbon Treaty.

From the very beginning, there was a strategy of not letting the citizens know anything about the European Union, besides the pre-arranged acclamations and enthusiastic praises made by governors and politicians. This was meant to stimulate in all Peoples a minimum of positive feelings towards the Unification. Since the journalist were accomplices with this silence, there never was any curiosity, interest, doubt or discussion about this matter.

The linguistic invention of the term "euroskeptical", which was immediately applied to whomever dared to have the smallest doubt, falsified even the position of the opponents. There was no acknowledgement of their legitimate right to oppose themselves to any political idea:

they were put in a sort of 'limbo' within the european Parliament.

"Euroskeptical" is a word without substance: it means that one cannot be against the european union, he can only be a "skeptical", a cold coward unable of real thinking.

But if someone dares to insist in an unfavorable opinion against the European union, he would immediately pass into the "europhobic" category: another invention that considers mentally ill those opposing to the EU. From a political point of view, they are completely devoid of any interest, and can only be handed over to a psychiatrist.

Vaclav Klaus inhabits the nightmares of the european governors: he has the negative label of a stubborn eurosceptic who for many years withstood flatteries and menaces. But now, after the "Yes" of the Irish people and of the Polish president, his position became very difficult.

The future english prime minister, Mr. Cameron, chief of the Conservative party, promised to hold a referendum about the European unification. He probably hopes that Klaus will quickly sign the Lisbon Treaty, so that he will have a good reason for not keeping his promise; since he knows very well that the vast majority of the English would answer "No".

But - as everybody knows and thinks it is the right thing to do - the European union was created with the precise goal of getting rid of all the constraints coming from democracy, homeland, Nations and from the People's desires: this is why the much praised "mother of democracies" has no hesitation to ratify their death.

We would like to suggest to Mr. Klaus - as a last proof of his love for his homeland - to resign from presidency if the EU wants to force him to sign. 65% of the Czech people are on his side, as millions of european citizens who were

never allowed to make their voice heard and do not want to lose their freedom and national independence.

We do not know which is the procedure to nominate a new President, but it is sure that if the Lisbon Treaty will not be approved, the European union will not be able to choose Blair as its President, as they plan to do with the precise goal of defusing the bomb of the english referendum.

It would be necessary a much longer time, and at that point probably Cameron would win the elections: then he would be able to keep his promise to the voters, announcing the referendum.

If Klaus really is convinced that the european unification is evil, his temporary sacrifice would be the most just act in front of his conscience and of all of us.
